Introduction:

This summary is presented by the jurors for the January 2015 term. Although we missed 4 days due to the snowy winter this year, we were able to meet on 27 days and heard 795 cases. Of those we were able to present 794 "True Bills" and 1 "No True Bill." Recommendations on bond amounts and charges were made as well.

Preparation:

Considerable efforts were made to provide this grand jury with necessary information orienting us as we prepared to hear cases. Printed materials, speakers, and field trips provided us with a basic understanding of the criminal justice system and a base of knowledge that would be helpful as we heard cases.

Printed materials: In addition to the General Charge, we received an overview of the criminal justice system, a glossary of terms, and information on "Our Kids", the Warrant Division, and the Police Department Precinct.

Observations & Recommendations

- The time frame of cases presented was of concern to us. There seemed to be a significant delay in hearing cases. Some of the cases were over a year in preparation. This is especially disturbing with child abuse cases.
- Some of the cases seem like they would have been more appropriately heard in General Sessions court. Is this used as a delay tactic or a way to get a better DA?
- The illegal sale of prescription drugs continues to be a serious problem.
- The number of priors for many of the suspects is staggering. Should there be harsher sentences for repeat offenders.
- Are schools addressing anger management issues? Many of the cases appear to be intensified by the suspect's inability to handle anger. This seem especially true with the young adult population.
- There appears to be an increase of domestic violence cases. This could be a result of the restructuring in that area that enables the cases to be processed more efficiently. We wish more resources could be put into preventing domestic violence.
- Presenters are usually well prepared in presenting information before the Grand Jury which makes it easier/better when deciding if a true bill should be issued.
- Although the District Attorney's office puts considerable effort into deciding the actual charges made against the offenders, we did adjust a few, adding or decreasing charges.
- Some of the cases were difficult and although we did "true bill" many of those, we trust the judges to sort out the humanity issues in their pursuit of justice.
- It does appear in dealing with children, the caseworkers need to have more training in balancing the needs of the child with the needs of the custodial adult. This is not a legalistic area.

Presentment

One case resulted in no action because the defendant did not purposely discharge his firearm.

Remarks

Parking on Bank Street made it much easier for jurors to arrive on time or early. As a result we were able to begin before 8:30 on many days.

Stan's donuts were greatly appreciated and helped on many of the long morning sessions. Having coffee and hot water available were beneficial also. Larger cups would be a good improvement as would adding a microwave to the break room.
