



Complaints made to MNCO

In 2021, 24 civilian complaints have been made to MNCO. In 2020, 37 civilian complaints were made. Of these 2020 and 2021 cases, 21 (34%) are currently open investigations. MNCO has initiated 7 investigation(s) at the direction of the Executive Director in 2021. In 2020, 6 director-initiated investigations were opened. Currently, 11 (85%) director-initiated investigations are open. From 2019, 1 case remains open.





2021 Civilain Complaints and Director-Initiated Investigations by Zip Code







Complainant Demographics


